The CHEA Committee on Recognition and the Board of Directors reviewed the Project Management Institute Global Accreditation Center for Project Management Education Programs (GAC). The review was based on the six CHEA recognition standards that require an accrediting organization to show that its accreditation process advances academic quality, demonstrates accountability, encourages self-scrutiny and planning, employs fair and appropriate procedures and demonstrates ongoing review of practice, and that it possesses sufficient resources to carry out its accreditation processes (2006 CHEA Recognition Policy and Procedures, Paragraphs 12A-12F, pp. 5-8).

The Board of Directors continued to defer recognition in order to obtain additional evidence that programs accredited by GAC provide reliable information to the public on their performance, including student achievement as determined by the institution or program (Paragraph 12(B)(1), 2006 Recognition Policy and Procedures).

Prior Actions on GAC's Application for Recognition
