## Most Recent Recognition Action

Date: CHEA Board of Directors Meeting, January 24, 2022

Decision: The CHEA Board of Directors awarded initial CHEA-recognition for a term of sevenyears with an Interim Report due at the midpoint of the recognition term (December 1, 2025). The Interim Report is to specifically address Standards 10.A., 11.C.1., and 12.H. (2021 Standards 1.A., 1.B., 4.B., and 3.I.)

### Summary of Prior Recognition Decisions

Board will review at its January 24, 2022 meeting.
