

Competency Attainment and Assessment – Programmatic Accreditation Practices

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What do specialized and professional accreditors do?

- Set educational standards that protect the public interest by producing safe and competent practitioners in the students' chosen professions or fields of study.
- Accreditation standards are profession specific and
- Developed through an inclusive process, with input from expert stakeholders in the profession:
 - practitioners,
 - employers and industry,
 - educators,
 - professional associations, and
 - other communities of interest.



Who is ASPA?

- Collaborative forum and collective voice for accreditors of specialized and professional higher education programs/schools in USA
- Established 1993
- 61 members
 - Nursing, architecture, engineering, physical therapy
 - >25,000 programs accredited
- Twice yearly conferences professional development
- Member service reports/guidelines on accreditation practice (e.g. competency practices)
